#### **New Business**

<u>Jester's Creek East Outfall Phase 1 Replacement:</u> Program Management and Engineering Manager Kelly Taylor presented a recommendation on the Jester's Creek East Outfall Phase 1 Replacement.

The total estimated project costs for Phase 1 of the Jesters Creek East Outfall Replacement (8,900 feet), including the construction contract, CCWA purchased pipe, CCWA provided services during construction, supplementary services during design and construction, and easement acquisition services is estimated to be \$8,750,000.

This recommendation is to move forward with the pipeline replacement project, which includes specific recommendations for Board approval of the construction contract and a pipe purchase. Other project components, summarized above for multiple goods and/or services, will be procured and paid for in alignment with CCWA procurement policy which will include a variety of procurement methods including warehouse inventory issues, quotes, existing annual contracts and in some cases, like the easement acquisitions, by negotiation. It is not anticipated that any of the other project components will require board approval per our CCWA procurement policy. This is the second project to be funded from the recently executed loan from the Georgia Environmental Finance Authority (GEFA).

#### Recommendation:

CCWA staff recommended awarding the Jester's Creek East Phase 1 project to Ruby-Collins, Inc. based on the total bid amount of \$6,967,979.80. Staff also recommended awarding the purchase of pipe to HOBAS at the unit bid pricing provided with Flowtite as the secondary or backup vendor in the event HOBAS is not able to deliver as needed.

UPON MOTION by Rodney Givens and second by Robin Malone, it was unanimously

RESOLVED to award the contract for the Jester's Creek East Outfall Phase 1 Replacement to Ruby Collins, Inc. at a total cost of \$6,967,979.80 along with awarding the pipe purchase for this project to HOBAS at the unit bid pricing provided with Flowtite as the secondary or backup vendor in the event that HOBAS is unable to deliver as needed.

Northeast WRF Process Modeling Support: Program Management and Engineering Manager Kelly Taylor presented a recommendation on the Northeast WRF Process Modeling Support.

The Northeast Water Reclamation Facility (WRF) discharges treated effluent to Panther Creek in accordance with the National Pollution Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Permit No. GA0020575. The plant is currently operating under the B1 limits of the permit which includes a maximum monthly average daily flow (MMADF) limit of 6 MGD. The permit also includes B2 limits with a MMADF of 10 MGD and more stringent effluent requirements for total phosphorus and ammonia.

Since commissioning in 2008, the Northeast WRF has operated below the 6 MGD flow limit. The current effluent ammonia-nitrogen limit (B1) is 1.3 mg/L (monthly average) and the new effluent ammonia-nitrogen limit (B2) will be 0.5 mg/L (monthly average). A recent review of data indicated that effluent ammonia concentrations had been close to the B2 limit, and CCWA staff would like to perform a review of the plant capacity with respect to nitrification.

This project will determine if any modifications or upgrades will be required to plant processes in order to reliably meet and be in compliance with the 0.5 mg/L B2 limit at the MMADF of 10 MGD. Should upgrades be required, they will be combined with upgrades from the phosphorus polishing plant so they can be executed under a single design/construction package in an effort to promote efficiency of resources and cost savings.

#### Recommendation:

CCWA staff recommended the awarding of Task Order JA-RE-19-01 to Jacobs in the amount not to exceed \$78,306.00 for Northeast WRF Process Modeling Support. Staff recommends award of the project and to authorize the General Manager to execute the task orders.

UPON MOTION by Marie Barber and second by Robin Malone, it was

RESOLVED to award Task Order JA-RE-19-01 to Jacobs Engineering at the not to exceed cost of \$78,306.00. In favor: John Chafin, Marie Barber, John Westervelt, Dr. Cephus Jackson, Robin Malone and Vivian Baldwin. Abstain: Rodney Givens. Motion passes.

**Boom Truck Purchase Recommendation:** General Services Manager Brent Taylor presented a recommendation on the purchase of a Boom Truck.

Our plant services crane/boom truck has reached the fleet assessment guidelines for annual replacement. The criteria are based on age, mileage, and percentage of maintenance costs versus the original purchased price, along with the fleet maintenance supervisor's and executive managers' reviews.

UPON MOTION by John Westervelt and second by Marie Barber, it was unanimously

RESOLVED to award the purchase of a Boom Truck to Peach State Freightliner at the State Contract price of \$284,200.00.

Water & Wastewater Treatment Chemicals Bid Recommendation Update: Production Manager Kendra Stanciel presented an updated recommendation on the Water & Wastewater Treatment Chemicals Bid.

Recommendations for Water and Wastewater Chemical Bids were brought before the Board on March 7, 2019. A recommendation was presented to the Board pertaining to the identical bids for Sodium Silica Fluoride between Brenntag Mid-South and Chemrite. According to our instructions to bidders, in the event of two or more vendors that are identical in price, meets delivery and bid specifications as well as the criteria set forth in the document, splitting of the award was recommended. Brenntag would supply Sodium Silica Fluoride the first six months of the year and Chemrite would supply Sodium Silica Fluoride the second six months of the year.

Our current supplier of Sodium Silica Fluoride is Brenntag, however the product they are currently supplying us with and that they based their 2019-2020 bid price on (WEGO) is not performing well in our treatment process. We reached out to Brenntag and informed them of the issue we were experiencing with the WEGO brand and they sent a different brand of Sodium Silica Fluoride as a replacement. Brenntag then informed us that they wouldn't be able to honor their submitted bid price for Fluoride if we needed a different fluoride material because the new product would come at a higher cost. We then reached out to Chemrite to see if they could provide us a fluoride product other than WEGO at the same bid price continuing to meet all bid package requirements for the Fluoride product and they agreed to do so.

#### Recommendation:

Being that Chemrite will honor their bid price and supply us with a different Fluoride material other than the WEGO product, staff recommends awarding the 2019-2020 bid for Sodium Silica Fluoride to Chemrite for the bid term of May 1, 2019 to April 30, 2020.

UPON MOTION by John Westervelt and second by Rodney Givens, it was unanimously

RESOLVED to award the bid for Sodium Silica Fluoride to Chemrite at the bid pricing provided for the term May 1, 2019 to April 30, 2020.

<u>Tandem Dump Truck Purchase Recommendation:</u> Stormwater Manager Kevin Osbey presented a recommendation on the purchase of a Tandem Dump Truck.

The Clayton County Water Authority Stormwater Utility's maintenance department operates with four crews. One crew mainly performs ditch maintenance along the road right of way, in addition to pipe repair and replacement of storm drain infrastructure. Currently, this crew has a Tandem Dump Truck that was purchased in June 2007.

After nearly 12 years of service, this Tandem Dump has reached a point of not being a reliable "frontline" unit. The years of daily use has resulted in both increased maintenance costs and lost productivity. Staff has requested to replace this older unit, this fiscal year.

Stormwater staff worked with Peach State Freightliner to develop a specification package that provides a Tandem Dump that meets our needs.

Peach State Freightliner, which has the State Contract for this size/class of truck, submitted pricing for a Freightliner 114SD Chassis which includes a 16.5' Maverick Dump Body.

#### Recommendation:

CCWA staff recommended purchasing one (1) new 2020 Freightliner Truck with Dump Body for \$115,268 under State Contract #99999-SPD-I0000039-0002.

UPON MOTION by Rodney Givens and second by John Westervelt, it was unanimously

RESOLVED to award the purchase of a Boom Truck to Peach State Freightliner at the State Contract price of \$115,268.00.

<u>Dump Truck Purchase Recommendation:</u> Stormwater Manager Kevin Osbey presented a recommendation on the purchase of three dump trucks.

Several flatbed dump trucks for the Distribution & Conveyance Department and Stormwater Department were purchased in 2007. After nearly 12 years of service, these flatbed dumps have reached a point of not being reliable "frontline" units. The years of daily use has resulted in both increased maintenance costs and lost productivity.

Staff has requested to replace three units: Two (2) in Distribution & Conveyance and one (1) in Stormwater for this fiscal year.

Staff worked with Peach State Freightliner to develop a specification package that meets our needs. Therefore, staff is going to a traditional Dump instead of a Flatbed Dump.

Peach State Freightliner, which has the State Contract for this size/class of truck, submitted pricing for a Freightliner M2 106 Chassis which includes a 12' Duraclass Dump Body.

CCWA staff recommended purchasing three (3) new 2020 Freightliner Trucks with Dump Body for \$96,790 (each) under State Contract #99999-SPD-I0000039-0002. Two of the

three will be replacing existing Flatbed Dump Trucks. The third unit will be a new purchase for a Distribution & Conveyance Crew.

UPON MOTION by Marie Barber and second by Robin Malone, it was unanimously

RESOLVED to award the purchase of three (3) Dump Trucks to Peach State Freightliner at the State contract price of \$96,790.00 each for a total of \$290,370.00.
