CCWA Earns Industry Awards



CCWA employees proudly picked up several awards during the Georgia Association of Water Professionals Fall Conference in Novembe

Distribution maintenance staff earned a Distribution System Platinum Award. Water distribution system programs focus on maintenance of the water lines that deliver potable water from CCWA's system to homes and businesses. CCWA maintains approximately 1,500 miles of water lines throughout the county. Utilities must earn a quantitative inspection score of 95 or higher for five consecutive years to earn a Platinum Award.

Conveyance maintenance staff brought home its 5th Collection System Platinum Award. Wastewater collection (or conveyance) system programs focus on maintenance of the sewer

lines that collect sewage from homes and businesses and safely transport it through a network of pipes to the treatment plants. CCWA maintains approximately 1,300 miles of sewer lines throughout the county

Senior Laboratory Analyst Jay Patel earned the Water Environment Federation (WEF) Analyst Excellence Award for outstanding performance, professionalism, and contributions to the water quality analysis profession.

Patel works in CCWA's Central Wastewater Laboratory housed in the W.B. Casey Water Resource Recovery Facility in Jonesboro. He oversees the Quality Assurance/Quality Control and compliance analysis for all three water reclamation facilities and Natural Treatment Systems.

Protect Your Pipes When Temperatures Drop

Pipes that freeze most frequently are those that are exposed to severe cold, like outdoor hose bibs, swimming pool supply lines, water sprinkler lines, and water supply pipes in unheated interior areas like basements and crawl spaces, attics, garages, or kitchen cabinets. Pipes that run against exterior walls that have little or no insulation are also subject to freezing.



During Cold Weather, Take Preventative Action
• Keep garage doors closed if there are water supply lines in the garage.

- When the weather is very cold outside, let the cold water drip from the inside faucet served by exposed pipes. Running water through the pipe even at a trickle helps prevent pipes from freezing.
- Keep the thermostat set to the same temperature during the day and at night.
- If you will be going away during cold weather, leave the heat on in your home, set to a temperature no lower than 55° F.
- Disconnect hoses, splitters or connectors from outside spigots/hose bibs.
 Install a foam insulated spigot/hose bib cover

on all outdoor faucets. These square or dome-shaped covers may be purchased at your local home improvement store. For information on how to thaw frozen pipes, visit ccwa.us.

CCWA Replaces more than 1,000 feet of Sanitary Sewer Pipe Off Mt. Zion Road in Morrow

CCWA recently completed a sanitary sewer replacement job behind Carrabbas and Taco Bell on Mt. Zion Road in Morrow after our Conveyance staff determined the existing ductile iron sewer lines were corroded and deteriorating. Construction Services staff then worked with our annual services contractor, Don Hall Construction, who began work on October 14 to install 1,020 feet of 8-inch PVC pipe and four new manholes to replace the existing pipe and manholes. As you can see in the photos, the bottom of the ductile iron pipe was totally gone. One of the key benefits of using PVC pipe is that it provides decades of corrosion free service life.


CCWA Construction Services managed the project, which took place in the middle of a busy retail/restaurant property at 1900 Mt. Zion Road. The Construction Inspector made sure businesses were notified

of the work prior to the start of the project and provided weekly updates to the property manager. He also estimated the project, ordered the material, inspected our contractors' work, approved invoices and updated CCWA records upon completion. Final restoration was completed on November 25.


