Low Income Household Water Assistance Program (LIHWAP) Available to Assist Clayton County Residents with Water Bills

CCWA and Clayton County Community Services Authority, Inc. have partnered to bring the Low-Income Household Water Assistance Program (LIHWAP) to Clayton County residents. LIHWAP is a federal program that helps low-income households pay for drinking water and wastewater for their homes. This program will help pay home water bills if the water bill is in the customer's name, or if they can verify they are experiencing a water burden. Funding is provided through the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021. The program aims to help low-income households with utility bill payments.

LIHWAP assists low-income households up to \$500 in rate reduction and assistance with arrearages pertaining to their water bills. Water assistance is provided through this program once per calendar year and will operate until funds are exhausted. Assistance is based on the client's gross income and household size. Priority target groups include those whose bills are past due, age 60 or over, and/or persons with a disability, and/or at least with one child under 5 (five) years of age in the home. CCWA Implements New Military Discount

CCWA's Affordability Programs now includes a new Military Discount option for customers who are active, reserve or retired military. Eligible customers will be required to complete the program application and show proof of active military or veteran's status via veteran or military identification card, DD214 or Driver's License with veteran's symbol. Benefits include:

- Waiving new service for new customers (currently \$25) or providing a \$25 credit for existing customers transferring service
- •Courtesy removal of disconnect fee of \$40 (two within a 12-month rolling period).

Conserve Water AND Save Money by Finding & Fixing These Common Household Leaks

Household leaks contribute to the loss of more than 1 trillion gallons of water per year. Help save water and money on your bill by finding leaks in your home.

- ✓ Faucets A leaky faucet that drips at the rate of one drip per second can waste more than 3,000 gallons per year! Check faucets in the bathroom and kitchen periodically. Worn washers are most often the cause of dripping faucets.
- ✓ Toilets Toilet leaks are the most common household leak! You can use food coloring or dye tablets to check your toilet. Have a leak? It might be your flapper. Replacing an old flapper is a quick, easy and inexpensive fix. Just visit your local hardware store.
- ✓ Showerheads A showerhead leaking at 10 drips per minute wastes more than 500 gallons per year. Check your showerhead for leaks to avoid costly drips!
- ✓ Sprinklers Broken sprinkler heads or damaged underground pipes are common sources of sprinkler system leaks. Watch your system run at least once per month to spot problems early.
